NEWS FLASH FROM THE PARISH:

We would like to inform all Parents that have children in Greek School, Sunday School, GOYA, and Hellenic Golden Coins, that they need to fill out and sign a "Stewardship" Pledge Card in order for their children to be registered in our Church organizations. It's sad that we have to enforce these rules but we have parents who bring their children to the church to enjoy our facilities and our events and never think that they need to support their church. Well it just doesn't work that way. We need to understand that it takes a whole Village working together for a common cause. Some people in the parish think that by coming to church and lighting a candle, or buying a raffle ticket, or purchasing a dinner or a dance ticket is the way to go. This is not the way we are supposed to support our Stewardship Program. Four times a year we send out Stewardship Pledge Cards to all our parishioners and the response is always underperforming from our church members. If we go by the UPR (Uniform Parish Regulations form the Archdiocese, it states that a parishioner in good financial standing must be 18 years and older, be current in his/her stewardship and other financial obligations to the Parish. All parishioners must abide by the regulations and cooperate in every way towards the welfare and well being of the Community. So please, when you receive your Pledge Card in the mail, fill it out, sign it with all the information, put your offering that you feel comfortable with and send it to the church office. We have so many young adults and married couples that neglect to participate in the Stewardship Program, but they like using the church facilities for their Sacraments and other activities.
