Pastoral Message

WHY I BELIEVE IN GOD

Someone once asked me to preach on, "Why I believe in God". I thought it would be an easy task. Ideas began to

flash before me...thoughts of theology, arguments I learned in defending existence of God, and works I studied that affirmed my belief and faith. But then I realized I believed in God...long before theology became important to me. I knew that it is necessary for me to breathe and that without air I would die. I was nurtured in a home where simple prayers were recited daily, icons were displayed throughout, the smell of incense filled the

air, and faith in action. I was taken to church and that seemed right to me. I felt at home in my church and never questioned my faith.

I love Christ and am grateful for the gift of Grace enabling me to work out my salvation. I recalled that in an American court, a person is presumed innocent until he is proven guilty. So it is with my own belief in God. Instead of saying I will not believe in God until his existence is proved, I will continue to believe, until it is proven that there is no God. The Bible does not attempt to prove God's existence. The first words are: "IN THE BEGINNING GOD"...and it goes on to give us a progressive revelation of God. Some great Saints in the Bible had spec-

tacular conversions...Matthew, the tax collector, Zaccheus the tax collector of Jericho, Mary the Harlot, and the

Apostle Paul. Examples in our age might include, Thomas Jefferson, a great intellectual whom many describe as agnostic, whom I believe was a believer in God...C.S. Lewis of recent times and many more.

For most of us God is just there. We seldom give it a second thought. Some go away to school and we become confused...we see the church and the faithful leading double standards. We take note of inconsis-

tencies that have nothing to do with the belief in God. Pain and suffering cause us to ask painful questions about God's love and we simply do not understand. Most of us cannot explain the composition of water, but we drink it. None of us know what electricity is, but we use it. Who can understand the process of love? Yet many have given their lives in sacrifice because they loved. Though we cannot explain God, most of us agree with Christopher Morley..." I had a thousand questions to ask God; but when I met him, they all fled and didn't seem to mat-

ter." To say I believe in God means

more than just an intellectual assent to

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Him and to commit our lives to His will. We trust in God because we know our own weaknesses and inadequacies.

As long as we feel sufficient to ourselves we do not need God; we call upon our own god. No person ever really discovers God until there is a felt need in his life that only God can fill. *Until you need him, you won't have him...* We sometimes say it is our duty to go to church, and it is; but few go for this reason. I would prefer that no one come to church just for a sense of duty. A duty-bound Christian is not a committed soul.

The ones who come just from a sense of duty come to criticize. They won't sense the presence of God. When one sings in the liturgy, one senses the voice that rings out of devotion and need and not a duty hymn. You have expressed your belief in God in the Creed...there is much more to it than that. When Peter confessed, "Lord Save Me", Jesus reached out His hand and caught him. When

you say I need you God, that is belief. Simply going through the motions of lighting candles and making token gifts to the church is not belief. And the superstitious belief is dangerous. Just making the cross three times, bowing like a robot, belief is deeper than that.

The nominal Christians are in danger of losing their salvation. Belief begins by knowing God. I hear a person say, I believe in so and so...why, because of an acquaintance. God has revealed himself to us...there is a matter of struggling in ourselves. Never know all of Him. Stand before the ocean, now carry me, taste the salt, I know not the entire ocean.

The man who came to Jesus... "Lord, I know I have no faith, help me to believe..." Worship, prayer, confession and bible reading will enable us to meet and know the God of whom we have said since childhood...I BELIEVE.

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Triodion: The First of Four Sundays before Pascha

This year's Triodion, the ten-week season of spiritual preparation that precedes Pascha, begins on Sunday, February 13th. The Triodion and the liturgical hymn book used during the period, also called the Triodion or Book of Three Odes, both derive their names from the fact that the Canons sung during this period have three rather than the usual nine odes.

The Pre-Lenten portion of Triodion is twenty two days which includes four Sundays that teach valuable spiritual principles intended to guide and strengthen us through Great Lent. The primary spiritual theme of each of these Sundays is found in the Gospel reading for the day.

The fourth Sunday before Lent is called the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee because the day's Gospel recounts Jesus' parable about the contrasting manner of the two men's prayer in the Temple (LK.18: 10-14). We learn from Him that the correct attitude for one who desires to draw near to God and to obtain His mercy is one of humility, contrition and sincere repentance. The Lord condemns the Pharisee's self-righteousness and arrogant pride.

The following Sunday the Church offers us the Parable of the Prodigal Son (LK.15: 11-32). We are entreated in the Gospel to return from 'the far country' of sin and estrangement from God to our true, lost spiritual home where we are assured of our Heavenly Father's loving embrace and unconditional forgiveness.

The parable assures us that nothing, no failure of ours, no sin of ours is powerful enough to separate us from His love and not only will our rejection of those things alien to God's will be accepted by Him, but also be a cause of great heavenly joy.

The next Sunday of Triodion is called Meat Fare Sunday because during the following week the Church prescribes abstention from meat as a gradual entrance into the rigorous Lenten fasting to follow.

The spiritual emphasis of the day is the Last Judgment at the Lord's Second Coming. The Gospel reading commemorates these events through Christ's parable of the sheep and the goats. (Mt. 25: 31-46). In it the Lord explains that He will separate the sheep (the righteous who will be saved) from the goats (those condemned) on the basis of the love and mercy each person has or has not demonstrated to those in need.

The Church's emphasis on The Last Judgment is intended to remind us of two very important truths.

The First is that all who have fallen asleep in the Lord are assured of the Resurrection to eternal life. It is no accident that the first Saturday of the Souls falls the day before the Sunday of the Last Judgment.

Secondly, the Church wishes to soberly remind and warn us that Christ's judgment is real and that a primary basis for His judgment is whether or not we have, in accordance with His commandments, ministered to those who are sick, suffering and in despair.

Finally, we are forcefully reminded that Christ identified Himself fully with our human nature and all of humanity, especially the 'least' of us.

The final Sunday before Lent is called Cheese fare Sunday because the Church prescribes the elimination of dairy products from the following Monday to Easter Sunday. The expulsion of Adam and Eve from Paradise is commemorated on this day in order to dramatically illustrate the dreadful consequences of sin.

In the Gospel for the day (Mt. 6: 14-21) Christ sets forth three of the most important conditions for overcoming the destructive power of sin in our lives - forgiveness of others, fasting and the renunciation of earthly pleasures, pursuits and rewards. The Lord's emphasis on the necessity of forgiving others as a prerequisite of His forgiving our sins is the reason Cheese Fare Sunday is also called Forgiveness Sunday.

With this last Sunday of the Pre-Lenten portion of Triodion, on which our Lord reminds us that where our treasure is there will our hearts be also, we must all look into our own hearts as we prepare them to embark on the joyous, though difficult, Lenten journey to encounter the Risen Christ.

Στοχασμοί για το Τοιώδιο

Εφέτος το Τοιώδιο, η εποχή πνευματικής προετοιμασίας των δέκα εβδομάδων που προηγούνται του Πάσχα, αρχίζει τις 13 Φεβρουαρίου. Το λειτουργικό βιβλίο των Ύμνων, που χρησιμοποιεί η Ορθόδοξη Εκκλησία κατά την διάρκεια του Τριωδίου, ονομάζεται επίσης «Το Τριώδιον» ή το «Βιβλίο των τριων Ωδών». Παίρνει το όνομά του από το γεγονός ότι, κατά την διάρκεια του Τριωδίου, πολλοί από τους Κανόνες περιέχουν μόνον τρεις ωδές αντί από τις συνηθισμένες εννέα.

Το αρχικό μέρος του Τριωδίου αποτελείται από 22 ημέρες, ή τέσσερεις διαδοχικές Κυριακές. Στο διάστημα αυτό, διδάσκονται σημαντικά μαθήματα μετάννοιας και άλλων πνευματικών αρχών, που προετοιμάζουν τους πιστούς για την Μεγάλη Τεσσαρακοστή. Το κυρίως πνευματικό θέμα αυτών των Κυριακών βρίσκεται στην περικοπή του Ευαγγελίου που διαβάζεται εκείνη την ημέρα.

Η τέταςτη Κυςιαχή ποιν από την Σαςακοστή ονομάζεται «Κυςιαχή του Τελώνου και Φαςισαίου», από την Ευαγγελική πεςικοπή που αναφέςεται στην παςαβολή του Ιησού για τον αντίθετο τρόπο προσευχής στο Ναό των δύο ανδρών (του Τελώνου και του Φαςισαίου) (κατά Λουκά 18 10-14). Η παςαβολή αυτή μας προειδοποιεί ότι ο σωστός τρόπος να πλησιάσει κάποιος τον Θεό, να Του ζητήσει έλεος, είναι να το πράξει με ταπεινότητα, και ειλικρινή μετάννοια, όπως ο Τελώνης. Η αυτοδικαιολογία και η περηφάνεια του Φαςισαίου κρίνονται και κατακρίνονται από τον Κύριο.

Την επομένη Κυσιακή η Εκκλησία μας αναφέσεται στην παραβολή του Άσωτου Υιού (κατά Λουκά 15, 11-32). Καθώς συνεχίζομε την προετοιμασία μας για την Μεγάλη Τεσσαρακοστή, η Εκκλησία μας ζητά να επιστρέψουμε από «την μακρινή χώρα» της αμαρτίας και του χωρισμού μας από τον Θεό, στο αληθινό, αλλά χαμένο, πνευματικό μας σπίτι, όπου μας περιμένει η στοργική αγκαλιά και η άνευ όρων συγχώρηση και αγάπη του «ουράνιου Πατέρα μας». Η παραβολή αυτή μας βεβαιώνει ότι τίποτε δεν μπορεί να σταθεί ικανό να μας απομακρύνει από την αγάπη του Θεού.

Η επομένη Κυριαχή ονομάζεται της Απόκρεω, γιατί την εβδομάδα που ακολουθεί η Εκκλησία απαγορεύει το κρέας, σαν μία σταδιαχή είσοδο στην αυστηρή νηστεία που ακολουθεί.

Η πνευματική έμφαση της ημέρας είναι, η Ημέρα της Κρίσεως, ή η Δευτέρα Παρουσία. Η Ευαγγελική περικοπή αναφέρεται στη Δευτέρα Παρουσία του Κυρίου μας και στην Ημέρα της Κρίσεως, χρησιμοποιώντας την παραβολή των προβάτων και των εριφίων (κατά Ματθαίον 25, 31-46). Σ' αυτήν ο Κύριος εξηγεί ότι θα χωρίσει τα πρόβατα (τους καλούς) από τα ερίφια (τους κακούς) με κριτήριο την αγάπη και την ευσπλαχνία που έδειξε ή δεν έδειξε έκαστος εξ αυτών,σε αυτούς που είχαν ανάγκη.

Η έμφαση που δίνει η Εκκλησία μας στην Ημέρα της Κρίσεως έχει στόχο να μας υπενθυμίσει δύο πολύ σημαντικές αλήθειες.

Η πρώτη είναι ότι, όλοι όσοι πέθαναν και όσοι θα πεθάνουν εν Κυρίω, είναι βέβαιο ότι η Ανάσταση οδηγεί προς την αιώνια ζωή. Δεν είναι τυχαίο, το ότι το πρώτο Ψυχοσάββατο είναι την παραμονή της Κυριακής της Κρίσεως.

Η δεύτερη είναι ότι η Εχχλησία επιθυμεί να μας προειδοποιήσει, ότι η Δευτέρα Παρουσία σίγουρα θα έλθει. Η Κρίση του Κυρίου θα βασίζεται στο αν, σύμφωνα με τις

St. John Chrysostom Oratorical FESTIVAL

Introduced in 1983, the St. John Chrysostom Oratorical Festival provides Greek Orthodox teenagers the opportunity to write and talk about their faith. The Oratorical Festival Program begins at the parish level and is divided into three divisions:

- Elementary Division (local festival only) for students in grades 4–6
- Junior Division for students in grades 7–9
- Senior Division for student in grades 10–12.

The top speakers in the Junior and Senior Divisions advance to the district level. Two finalists in each district division represent the district at the Metropolis Oratorical Festival. The top speaker in each metropolis division is then selected to participate in the Archdiocese Finals, which is



hosted by a different metropolis each year.

All eighteen finalists at the Archdiocese Finals participate in a weekend of activities, the highlight of which is the delivery of their speeches on Saturday morning. The Oratorical Festival Scholarship Foundation provides college scholarships in the amount of \$2,000, \$1,500, and \$1,000 to the top three speakers in each division. In addition, those finalists who receive a rank of Honorable Mention are awarded a \$500 U.S. Savings Bond.

Our Sunday School is preparing to host its own Parish Oratorical Festival in March. The topics have been distributed to the students. We look forward to having all of our students participate in this program. Scholarship money at our local parish level will be awarded to the top 3 students in the Junior and Senior Divisions.


