Message from Fr. Michael L. Pastrikos HOLY WEEK IN THE EASTERN ORTHODOX CHURCH

Holy Week in the Eastern Orthodox Church consists of various services culminating in the celebration of Easter, the Feast of Feasts. In addition to every Sunday dedicated to the Resurrection, there are a total of 100 days in the calendar year which are dedicated to Easter. Fifty days prior to Easter, including Great Lent, are intended to strengthen our soul and body through repentance (change from our old sinful ways). Son of David, blessed is He that comes in the name of the Lord." Upon His entry, Jesus went immediately to the Temple, where He prayed and taught. Palm Sunday marks the final joyous event until the proclamation that Christ is risen.

Palm Sunday Evening Bridegroom Service — (Holy Monday service sung by anticipation on Palm Sunday evening)


prayer (deliberate thoughts of God) and self-control (willful control of our mind, tongue and body). The 50 days after Easter are known as the Pentecostarion and are dedicated to the celebration of our Lord's Resurrection.

Saturday Morning of St. Lazarus

On the day before Palm Sunday, we commemorate the rising of Lazarus from the dead. Just prior to entering the holy city of Jerusalem for the last time, Jesus, traveling through Bethany, was informed that His good friend Lazarus was gravely ill. Jesus did not go immediately to see His friend but waited until Lazarus was dead and lying in the tomb for 4 days. When Jesus arrived and found the sisters in mourning, He asked to go to the tomb. After praying, He commanded Lazarus to come out of his dark and dismal tomb. It is this miracle that draws the crowds to praise Him and the desire of the High Priest and elders to have Him killed.

Palm Sunday Morning

On this day, the Sunday before Easter, we celebrate the triumphant entry of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. Jesus was greeted by a multitude of people holding palm branches and spreading their cloaks on the road in a sign of respect crying out, "Hosanna to the



This service marks the beginning of Jesus' suffering. Through the Gospel reading we learn about the plotting by the High Priests and elders to disclaim Jesus as the Son of the Almighty. The church commemorates the blessed and noble Joseph of

the Old Testament who showed complete faith toward God and was not empty of it as were some of the Pharisees. The day also commemorates the fig tree which had leaves but no fruit. Jesus cursed the fruitless tree to become withered which symbolizes those having empty lives and yielding no fruit. We also hear the beautiful "Hymn of the Bridegroom" as portrayed in the Icon of Christ the Bridegroom which is carried by the priest in a procession around the church.

Holy Monday—(Holy Tuesday service sung by anticipation on Monday evening)

This service's theme warns us to be prepared and watchful prior to our appearance before the awesome judgment seat of God. The Gospel reading imparts the parable of the Ten Virgins of which five were prepared with enough oil in their lamps to greet the Lord and enter into His bridal chamber. The other five were foolish by not bringing

enough oil and were left out. This parable warns us to be wisely prepared to ensure our entry into the Kingdom of Heaven.

Holy Tuesday—(Holy Wednesday service sung by anticipation on Tuesday evening)

The service this evening counsels us to repent from the life of sin to a life of faith and obedience. Through the act of anointing Christ with myrrh, the woman in the house of Simon the leper, showed sincere repentance of her sins. The Hymn of Kassiane, which relates the story of a repentant woman, is chanted this evening.

Holy Wednesday Morning

The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is celebrated for the last time during Great Lent. This solemn, ancient liturgy offers the Blood and Body of Christ which have been sanctified during the previous Sunday's Divine Liturgy.

Holy Wednesday—Sacrament of Holy Unction

Holy Wednesday is the evening of repentance, confession and remission of sins as the faithful partake of the Sacrament of Holy Unction. Seven epistles and seven gospels are read and prayers are offered to entreat the Holy Spirit to bless the oil and transform it into Holy Myrrh which is administered to the faithful.

Holy Thursday Evening—(Holy Thursday services are sung by anticipation on Thursday morning)

On Holy Thursday we commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist (thanksgiving) for it is on this day that Jesus went up to Mount Zion and into the Upper Room to partake of His Last Supper with His Twelve Apostles. Jesus instructed His disciples to partake of His Body and His Blood in remembrance of Him and for the forgiveness of sins. Knowing that His betraval was imminent, Jesus led His disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane where He prayed so intensely that bloody sweat poured from His face. Shortly thereafter, Judas Iscariot, one of His Twelve, betrayed Jesus by placing a kiss on His face. Jesus, the long awaited Messiah, was arrested and taken into custody like a criminal. It is during this Liturgy of St. Basil that the priest prepares the Holy Communion which is kept in the Tabernacle on the Holy Altar table throughout the year to be distributed to the faithful in times of illness. Jesus is forever in our midst.

Message from Fr. Michael L. Pastrikos

Holy Thursday Evening—Service of the Holy Passion (Good Friday is sung by anticipation on Thursday evening)

This is a day of great sadness in our church for on this day our Lord suffered spittings, scourgings, buffetings, scorn, mocking and humiliation; the reed, sponge, vinegar, nails, spear, purple robe, and crown of thorns; the Cross and Death. The King of Glory was crucified on Golgotha, also known as the Place of the Skull. Tradition states that Jesus was buried directly over the grave of Adam, the first man created by God. Death was most difficult for Jesus since He knew He would be separated from His Father. The Church commemorates this day with the reading of the Twelve Gospels which include His last instructions to His disciples, the stirring prayer of Christ and His new commandment. After the reading of the fifth Gospel, the priest carries the Crucifix around the church while chanting the moving hymn, "Today is hung upon the Tree." During the procession, the faithful kneel and then approach to reverently kiss the Crucifix. Many churches such as Saint Nicholas hold all night vigils where prayers are read and hymns are sung until sunrise.

Good Friday Morning

Good Friday is the day Jesus, the Son of God, was placed on the Cross to die for our sins. Since it is a day of extreme sorrow, the faithful observe it with strict fasting, prayer, cleanliness, self-examination, confession, repentance and good works in humility. The Royal Hours which consist of hymns, psalms and readings from the Old and New Testaments are read. It is the only day of the year when Divine Liturgy is not celebrated.

Good Friday Afternoon

This service is a continuation of the morning's Royal Hours memorializing Jesus' death on the Cross. During the Gospel reading, the priest removes the Body of Christ from the Cross, wraps it in a new white linen cloth and takes it into the Altar. The priest then carries the Epitafio (the cloth depicting the body of Jesus) around the church as the faithful are kneeling in reverence, and then places it in the Kouvouklion which symbolizes the Tomb of Christ. The service also commemorates Joseph of Arimathea, who buried the Sacred Body of Our Lord by wrapping It in clean linen and carried It to his unused tomb as was foretold in Old Testament scripture.

<u>Good Friday Evening</u>—(*This service is the Saturday* morning service sung by anticipation on Friday evening.)

This service depicts Christ's descent into Hades where He reconciles to God those who died before His first coming. The service begins with psalms, hymns and readings pertaining to the death of Christ, His divinity and expected Resurrection. Lamentations are sung before the Tomb of Christ, including verses about His unjust punishment and the shedding of His innocent blood. Many churches, such as Saint Nicholas, carry the Kouvouklion out and walk around the church as the faithful follow, carrying lit candles. Although the service is one of lament and sorrow, we leave with a symbol of hope, a flower from the Tomb.

Holy Saturday Morning—(Vespers and Divine Liturgy evening sung by anticipation on Saturday morning)

Today's service is known as the "First Resurrection" as it commemorates the resurrection of Adam and the defeat of death. During the Liturgy of St. Basil's Epistle reading, the priest tosses laurel leaves and rose petals throughout the church proclaiming, "Arise, O God, and judge Thou the earth; for Thou shall take all heathen to Thine inheritance." We also commemorate the Holy Myrrhbearers who, unlike the scattered disciples, appeared at the Tomb of Christ to perform the last act of love to Christ of anointing His Sacred Body.

Holy Sunday of Easter—(*Divine Liturgy of Sunday morning sung on Holy Saturday evening by anticipation*)

The Midnight Easter service celebrates the life-giving Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. After the Odes of Lamentation are chanted, the church is placed into complete darkness. The priest then emerges from the Royal Doors of the Altar with a candle lit from the vigil light chanting, "Come ye and receive the light from the unwaning light." He gives the light to the faithful who are waiting with their unlit candles. The progression of light throughout the darkened church reminds us that the Light of our Lord permeates every corner of the world. The priest leads the congregation outside to proclaim the Life Giving Resurrection of Jesus Christ and triumphantly sings "Christos Anesti" Christ is Risen! Many beautiful resurrectional hymns are chanted before the faithful return into the church to celebrate the Diving Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom and listen to the Homily of St. John Chrysostom. The faithful then receive a dyed red Easter egg and take the light to their homes where the Light of Christ shines all year long.

Easter Saturday Afternoon Vespers—Agape Service

Once more the faithful gather with lighted candles and chant "Christ is Risen". The highlight of this service is the reading of the gospel in many languages, attesting that the Good News of the Resurrection has spread throughout the world. Easter is also known as the Sunday of Agape (love feast) as the faithful seek to end misunderstandings and arguments among fellow man.


