Answer each question to the best of your knowledge and include the following:

1. Applicants (male or female) must be a Greek Orthodox Christian.

- Complete Parish Information and Include Letter from the Parish Priest

2. The applicant must have a Philoptochos relationship – Scholarship applicant’s parent or legal guardian must be a member in good standing for a minimum of two years in Philoptochos. The chapter must be in the Metropolis of New Jersey and chapter name/number must be provided.

3. The applicant must be a high school senior expecting to matriculate into an accredited college or trade training program.

4. The applicant must provide original OFFICIAL current high school transcript, written essay, education, and extracurricular credentials.

5. The applicant must include (2) letters of recommendation, one being from your Parish priest and one from a non-relative who will write of your character, ideals, and values. It may be a teacher, counselor, employer, or a non-relative mentor, who knows you very well and can address these aspects of your character. It is recommended that each letter be limited to one page in length.
