

Message from Fr. Georgios Oikonomou, Protopresbyter

My beloved brothers and sisters in Christ, members of St. Nicholas Community!

We welcome the month of April, already in the fifth week of the Holy and Great Lent. As we approach the end of this spiritual journey, we prepare to witness the Holy Cross and the Resurrection of our Lord. Instead of a personal message, we share with you a moving text—the Catechetical Paschal Homily of St. John Chrysostom for the day of Easter. It is utterly worth studying and reflecting on its profound meaning. This text is a hymn to the love of our God and the significance of the Resurrection for each of us. You can read it in the original Greek, in an English translation, or in a free modern Greek translation.

The Catechetical Paschal Homily of our Father Among the Saints, St. John Chrysostom, Archbishop of Constantinople

If there are devout and God loving people here, let them enjoy this beautiful, radiant festival. If there are prudent servants, enter joyously into the Lord's joy. Whoever may be spent from fasting, enjoy now your reward. Whoever has toiled from the first hour, receive today your just settlement. If any came after the third hour, celebrate gratefully. If any of you arrived after the sixth, have no misgivings, you have lost nothing. If some have been as late as the ninth, come forward, do not be at a loss. If any of you have arrived only at the eleventh hour, do not be dismayed for being late. The Master is gracious: He accepts the last even as the first; He gives rest to those of the eleventh as well as to those who have labored from the first; He is lenient with the last while looking after the first; to the one He gives, to the other He gives freely; He accepts the labors and welcomes the effort; honors the deed, but commends the intent. So, all of you, enter into the joy of our Lord: first and second, share the bounty. Rich and poor alike, celebrate together. Sober or heedless, honor the day. Those who fasted and those who did not, rejoice today. The table is full, everyone fare sumptuously. The calf is fatted; no one go away hungry. Everyone, savor the banquet of faith; relish the riches of His goodness. No one need lament poverty, for the kingdom



is seen as universal. No one need grieve over sins; forgiveness has dawned from the tomb. No one need fear death; the Savior's death has freed us from it. While its captive He stifled it. He despoiled Hades as He descended into it; it was angered when it tasted His flesh. Foreseeing this, Isaiah proclaimed: "Hades," he said, "was angered when he met You below." It was angered because it was abolished. It was angered because it was mocked. It was angered because it was slain. It was angered because it was shackled. It received a body and encountered God. It took earth and came face to face with heaven. It took what it saw and fell by what it could not see. Death, where is your sting? Hades, where is your victory? Christ is risen and you are overthrown. Christ is risen and demons have fallen. Christ is risen and angels rejoice. Christ is risen and life rules. Christ is risen and not one dead remains in the tomb. For Christ, having risen from the dead, has become the firstfruits of those that slept. To Him be the glory and the dominion forever. Amen.

Λοιπόν εισέλθετε όλοι στην χαρά του Κυρίου μας, και απολαύστε τον μισθό τόσο οι πρώτοι όσο και οι δεύτεροι. Πλούσιοι και φτωχοί ενωθείτε σε χορό. Εγκρατείς και όσοι νικηθήκατε από τη ραθυμία τιμήστε την ημέρα. Ευφρανθείτε σήμερα όσοι νηστέψατε και όσοι δεν νηστέψατε. Το τραπέζι είναι γεμάτο, απολαύστε το όλοι, ο μόσχος είναι πολύς, κανείς μη φύγει πεινασμένος. Απολαύστε όλοι το συμπόσιο της πίστης. Κανείς να μη θρηνεί λόγω της φτώχειας, γιατί ανέτειλε το κοινό βασίλειο για όλους. Κανείς να μη κλαίει για τα αμαρτήματα, γιατί ανέτειλε συγγνώμη από τον τάφο του Κυρίου. Κανείς να μη φοβάται πια τον θάνατο, γιατί μας ελευθέρωσε από τον θάνατο ο θάνατος του Σωτήρα. Βρέθηκε μέσα στον τάφο και τον γκρέμισε. Κατέβηκε στον Άδη και τον κατανίκησε. Γεύτηκε ο Άδης την σάρκα του Χριστού και πικράθηκε, όπως προφητικά το διαλάλησε ο Ησαΐας σαν Σε συνάντησε ο Άδης κάτω πικράθηκε. Πικράθηκε και καταργήθηκε. Πικράθηκε και ξευτιλίστηκε. 

SATURDAY of LAZARUS - April 12th

Reading

Lazarus and his sisters Martha and Mary, the friends of the Lord Jesus, had given Him hospitality and served Him many times (Luke 10:38-4z; John 12:2-3). They were from Bethany, a village of Judea. This village is situated in the eastern parts by the foothills of the Mount of Olives, about two Roman miles from Jerusalem. When Lazarus - whose name is a Hellenized form of "Eleazar," which means "God has helped," became ill some days before the saving Passion, his sisters had this report taken to our Saviour, Who was then in Galilee. Nonetheless, He tarried yet two more days until Lazarus died; then He said to His disciples, "Let us go into Judea that I might awake My friend who sleepeth." By this, of course, He meant the deep sleep of death. On arriving at Bethany, He consoled the sisters of Lazarus, who was already four days dead. Jesus groaned in spirit and was troubled at the death of His beloved

friend. He asked, "Where have ye laid his body?" and He wept over him. When He drew nigh to the tomb, He commanded that they remove the stone, and He lifted up His eyes, and giving thanks to God the Father, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth." And he that had been dead four days came forth immediately, bound hand and foot with the grave clothes, and Jesus said to those standing there, "Loose him, and let him go." This is the supernatural wonder wrought by the Saviour that we celebrate on this day.

According to an ancient tradition, it is said that Lazarus was thirty years old when the Lord raised him; then he lived another thirty years on Cyprus and there reposed in the Lord. It is furthermore related that after he was raised from the dead, he never laughed till the end of his life, but that once only, when he saw someone stealing a clay vessel, he smiled and said, "Clay stealing clay." His grave is situated in the city of Kition, having the inscription: "Lazarus the four days dead and friend of Christ." In 890 his sacred relics were transferred to Constantinople by Emperor Leo the Wise, at which time undoubtedly the Emperor composed his stichera for Vespers, "Wishing to behold the tomb of Lazarus . . ."



Reading

On Sunday, five days before the Passover of the Law, the Lord came from Bethany to Jerusalem. Sending two of His disciples to bring Him a foal of an ass, He sat thereon and entered into the city. When the multitude there heard that Jesus was coming, they straightway took up the branches of palm trees in their hands, and went forth to meet Him. Others spread their garments on the ground, and yet others cut branches from the trees and strewed them in the way that Jesus was to pass; and all of them together, especially the children, went before and after Him, crying out: "Hosanna: Blessed is He

that cometh in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel" (John 12:13). This is the radiant and glorious festival of our Lord's entry into Jerusalem that we celebrate today.

The branches of the palm trees symbolize Christ's victory over the devil and death. The word Hosanna means "Save, I pray," or "Save, now." The foal of an ass, and Jesus' sitting thereon, and the fact that this animal was untamed and considered unclean according to the Law, signified the former uncleanness and wildness of the nations, and their subjection thereafter to the holy Law of the Gospel.

HOLY FRIDAY - APRIL 18th

When Friday dawned, Christ was sent bound from Caiaphas to Pontius Pilate, who was then Governor of Judea. Pilate interrogated Him in many ways, and once and again acknowledged that He was innocent, but to please the Jews, he later passed the sentence of death against Him. After scourging the Lord of all as though He were a runaway slave, he surrendered Him to be crucified.

Thus the Lord Jesus was handed over to the soldiers, was stripped of His garments, was clothed in a purple robe, was crowned with a wreath of thorns, had a reed placed in His hand as though it were a sceptre, was bowed before in mockery, was spat upon, and was buffeted in the face and on the head. Then they again clothed Him in His own garments, and bearing the cross, He came to Golgotha, a place of condemnation, and there, about the third hour, He was crucified between two thieves. Although both blasphemed Him at the first, the thief at His right hand repented, and said: "Remember me, O Lord, when Thou

comest in Thy Kingdom," to which our Saviour answered, "Today shalt thou be with Me in Paradise." As He hung upon the Cross, He was blasphemed by those who were passing by, was mocked by the high priests, and by the soldiers was given vinegar to drink mixed with gall. About the ninth hour, He cried out with a loud voice, saying, "It is finished." And the Lamb of God "Which taketh away the sin of the world" (John 1:29) expired on the day when the moon was full, and at the hour when, according to the Law, was slain the Passover lamb, which was established as a type of Him in the time of Moses.

Even lifeless creation mourned the death of the Master, and it trembled and was altered out of fear. Yet, even though the Maker of creation was already dead, they pierced Him in His immaculate side, and forthwith came there out Blood and Water. Finally, at about the setting of the sun, Joseph of Arimathea came with Nicodemus (both of them had been secret disciples of Jesus), and they took down the all-holy Body of the Teacher from the Cross and anointed it with aromatic spices, and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth. When they had buried Him in a new tomb, they rolled a great stone over its entrance.

Such are the dread and saving sufferings of our Lord Jesus Christ commemorated today, and in remembrance of them, we have received the Apostolic commandment that a fast be observed every Friday.

Apolytikion of Holy Friday

Plagal Of The First Tone

As the glorious disciples, in the washing of the feet, were enlightened, the profane Judas, ravaged by greed, was benighted. And to the lawless judges he surrenders You the just judge. Consider, you who love money, the one who hanged himself for the sake of it. Shun the insatiate heart that could dare such a deed against the Teacher. 
GREAT AND HOLY PASCHA - APRIL 20th

Mary Magdalene, and the other women who were present at the burial of our Saviour on Friday evening, returned from Golgotha to the city and prepared fragrant spices and myrrh, so that they might anoint the body of Jesus. On the morrow, because of the law which forbids work on the day of the Sabbath, they rested for the whole day. But at early dawn on the Sunday that followed, almost thirtysix hours since the death of the Life-giving Redeemer, they came to the sepulchre with the spices to anoint His body. While they were considering the difficulty of rolling away the stone from the door of the sepulchre, there was a fearful earthquake; and an Angel, whose countenance shone like lightning and whose garment was white as snow, rolled away the stone and sat upon it. The guards that were there became as dead from fear and took to flight. The women, however, went into the sepulchre, but did not find the Lord's body. Instead, they saw two other Angels in the form of youths clothed in white, who told them that the Saviour was risen, and they sent forth the women, who ran to proclaim to the disciples these gladsome tidings. Then Peter and John arrived, having learned from Mary Magdalene what had come to pass, and when they entered the tomb, they found only the winding sheets. Therefore, they returned again to the city with joy, as heralds now of the supernatural Resurrection of Christ, Who in truth was seen alive by the disciples on this day on five occasions.

Our Lord, then, was crucified, died, and was buried on Friday, before the setting of the sun, which was the first of His "three days" in the grave; observing the mystical Sabbath, that "seventh day" in which it is said that the Lord "rested from all His works" (Gen. 2:2-3), He passed all of Saturday in the grave; and He arose "while it was yet dark, very early in the morning" on Sunday, the third day, which, according to the Hebrew reckoning, began after sunset on Saturday.

As we celebrate today this joyous Resurrection, we greet and embrace one another in Christ, thereby demonstrating our Saviour's victory over death and corruption, and the destruction of our ancient enmity with God, and His reconciliation toward us, and our inheritance of life everlasting. The feast itself is called Pascha, which is derived from the Hebrew word which means "passover"; because Christ, Who suffered and arose, has made us to pass over from the curse of Adam and slavery to the devil and death unto our primal freedom and blessedness. In



addition, this day of this particular week, which is the first of all the rest, is dedicated to the honour of the Lord; in honour and remembrance of the Resurrection, the Apostles transferred to this day the rest from labour that was formerly assigned to the Sabbath of the ancient Law.

Archiepiscopal Encyclical on Greek Independence Day

March 25, 2025

Unto the Most Reverend and Right Reverend Hierarchs, Pious Priests and Deacons, the Monks and Nuns, Presidents and Members of Parish Councils, Honorable Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Members of Leadership 100, the Day and Afternoon Schools, Philoptochos Societies, the Youth, Greek Orthodox Organizations, and the entirety of the Christnamed Plenitude of the Holy Archdiocese of America:

The New Creation revealed the Creator by showing Himself to us whom He created (Akathist Hymn, Third Stasis, N)

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The "New Creation" that we celebrate every March 25th is both a spiritual and a political reality for Orthodox Christians of Greek descent, for Philhellenes around the world, and indeed for every human being. What occurred within the Ever-Virgin's womb is nothing less than the re-creation of the human race and, through us as God's chosen stewards, the entirety of the created cosmos. And what occurred in 1821 within the hearts and minds of Greek patriots, is nothing less than the re-creation of a Nation, to which we - as stewards - owe a debt of responsibility and fidelity.

The Annunciation of the Theotokos was perfected by the exercise of her freedom on behalf of every man, woman, and child who would ever live. And the Revolution of 1821, an astonishing exercise of liberty, led to the independence and ultimate rebirth of Hellas. The former was a Divine Act enabled by a human being; the latter, a human endeavor empowered

by a Divine Hand. In both, there was the grace of a Virgin Full-of-Grace, a young girl who incarnated the best of our aspirations to freedom, and was the Vessel of the Incarnation of God.

Let us never forget our Virgin Champion who manifests what it means to be truly free in God. And let us never the forget the Immortal Heroes of 1821, whose sacrifices showed the world what it means to fight and overcome tyranny, and to protect, defend, and prosper the People of Greece. Let us always choose to be that New Creation in Christ.

Long live 1821! Long live Democracy! Long live Greece!



GREEK SCHOOL

Η 25η Μαρτίου 1821 αδιαμφισβήτητα είναι μια από τις σημαντικότερες ημερομηνίες στην ελληνική ιστορία, καθώς σηματοδοτεί την έναρξη της Ελληνικής Επανάστασης κατά του Οθωμανικού ζυγού. Η ημέρα αυτή είναι διπλή γιορτή για τους Έλληνες, καθώς συμπίπτει με τον Ευαγγελισμό της Θεοτόκου, προσδίδοντας θρησκευτική και εθνική σημασία.

Η Ελληνική Επανάσταση ξεκίνησε επίσημα στις 25 Μαρτίου 1821, όταν ο Αλέξανδρος Υψηλάντης, αρχηγός της Φιλικής Εταιρείας, κήρυξε την επανάσταση στο Ιάσιο της Μολδαβίας και ο Παλαιών Πατρών Γερμανός ύψωσε το λάβαρό της. Η επανάσταση εξαπλώθηκε γρήγορα σε όλη την Ελλάδα, με τους Έλληνες να αγωνίζονται για την ελευθερία τους και την ανεξαρτησία τους. Ο Θεόδωρος Κολοκοτρώνης, ο Γεώργιος Καραϊσκάκης, ο Αθανάσιος Διάκος, ο Οδυσσέας Ανδρούτσος, η Λασκαρίνα Μπουμπουλίνα, Κωνσταντίνος Κανάρης, ο Ανδρέας Μιαούλης, ο Ρήγας Βελεστινλής (Φεραίος), η Μαντώ Μαυρογένους, ο Ιωάννης Μακρυγιάννης, ο Δημήτριος Υψηλάντης και ο Νικηταράς έχουν γράψει με χρυσά γράμματα τα ονόματά τους στην ιστορία του γένους μας για την αυτοθυσία και τους αγώνες τους υπέρ πίστεως και πατρίδας.

Με σκοπό να τιμήσουμε τους ηρωες αυτούς αλλά όλους όσους «έπεσαν» στα πεδία των μαχών δοξάζοντας την Ελλάδα μας, στις 30 Μαρτίου 2025, πραγματοποιήθηκε μια όμορφη παρέλαση στην Eastern Avenue για να τιμηθεί η 204η επέτειος της Ελληνικής Επανάστασης. Η παρέλαση αυτή ήταν ιδιαίτερα σημαντική, καθώς ανάμεσα στους συμμετέχοντες ήταν το Ελληνικό Σχολείο μας, διάφοροι πολιτιστικοί σύλλογοι από πολλά μέρη της Ελλάδας και ο σύλλογος Κύπρου.

Οι μαθητές του ελληνικού σχολείου παρέλασαν περήφανα, ενώ οι

πολιτιστικοί σύλλογοι παρουσίασαν παραδοσιακούς χορούς και τραγούδια, αναδεικνύοντας την πλούσια ελληνική κληρονομιά.

Η 25η Μαρτίου είναι μια ημέρα που γεμίζει τους Έλληνες με αισθήματα υπερηφάνειας και συγκίνησης. Είναι μια υπενθύμιση των αγώνων και των θυσιών των προγόνων μας για την ελευθερία και την ανεξαρτησία. Οι εκδηλώσεις και οι παρελάσεις που πραγματοποιούνται σε όλο τον κόσμο από τους Έλληνες της διασποράς, δείχνουν τη διαρκή σύνδεση με την πατρίδα και την πολιτιστική κληρονομιά μας γεμίζοντας τα παιδιά μας με όμορφες εμπειρίες που θα τους ακολουθούν για μια ζωη.

GREEK SCHOOL

March 25, 1821 is undoubtedly one of the most important dates in Greek history, as it marks the beginning of the Greek revolution against the Ottomans. This day is a double celebration for the Greeks, as it coincides with the Annunciation, giving religious and national importance.

The Greek revolution officially began on March 25, 1821, when Alexander Ypsilantis, leader of the Filiki Eteria, declared the revolution in Moldova, and Paleon Patron Germanos raised its banner. The revolution quickly spread throughout Greece, with the Greeks struggling for their freedom and their independence. Theodoros Kolokotronis, George Karaiskakis, Athanasios Diakos, Odysseas Androutsos, Laskarina Bouboulina.
