

Message from Fr. Georgios Oikonomou, Protopresbyter

My beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ, parishioners of St. Nicholas,

It was early December, two years ago, when I began my ministry as the priest of this blessed community. I thank and praise God for the privilege of being among you—a member of this beautiful community with its rich history, your brother in Christ, and also your spiritual father. As I have now completed two years of service, I feel it is fitting to reflect briefly on my experiences and ministry with you.

This reflection, however, will not center on me. In the Orthodox Church and tradition, the work we do is never our own; it is the work of Christ. Boasting of our accomplishments is meaningless, for the Church is not ours to claim—it is the vineyard of God. He is the Good Shepherd, and we are His sheep. He is the captain of the spiritual ship we sail, and we entrust our lives into His hands. Christ, the Great High Priest, is the one who administers the sacraments, blesses, and sanctifies. How, then, could we ever claim to do great work? That would be foolish arrogance and empty pride. Let us always remember the Lord's words: "Without me, you can do nothing" (John 15:5).

As faithful members of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, we humbly return the gifts God has given us and become humble laborers in His vineyard. For this reason, I cannot recount my own works but instead choose to acknowledge and honor yours-the remarkable efforts you have undertaken for the glory of God.

Foremost among these is your unwavering commitment to preserving and promoting our Orthodox faith and Hellenic heritage. Through your love, care, dedication, and volunteerism, you continue the sacred work entrusted to you by your ancestors. By protecting and honoring the holy traditions, your church and community stand as a vibrant testimony of Orthodoxy and Hellenism in the heart of America. You have resisted the allure of other religious traditions, remained steadfast in the faith of your Holy Baptism and Chrismation, and held fast to the memory of your homeland. Above all, you prioritize our Triune God and our beloved Greece.

You cherish the Greek language. This is demonstrated in our exceptional Greek School, one of the finest in the Diaspora. In the Greek School our children learn the Greek language, traditions, and history while forming lasting friendships and deepening their love for the Church.

You care deeply for your children, nurturing their future by instilling a love for our faith. This commitment is reflected in the flourishing ministries of GOYA, Sunday School, the Hellenic Golden Coins, and the children's roles in the sanctuary. These efforts will bear fruit. The seeds you plant now will ensure that the next generation loves the Church and carries on this blessed work. We pray that some of these children will enroll one day at the Hellenic College and Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School Of Theology, become priests, presvyteres, psaltes, Parish Council members and Presidents, and help elevate our community ever higher—continuing to serve as a living witness of Orthodoxy and Hellenism while embracing all who seek the Truth.

With these reflections, I have attempted to focus, as the saying goes, on "the glass half full." Of course, there are shortcomings, mistakes, and much room for growth in every aspect of our ministry. This serves as a reminder of our human frailty and the Lord's words that without Him, we can do nothing.

As we approach the final days of 2024 and look forward to the new year, 2025, and the years ahead, let us pray from the depths of our hearts. May God, through the intercessions of our beloved Saint Nicholas—whose feast day we will soon celebrate—bless our community, protect the world, and grant peace to all.

ΜΗΝΥΜΑ ΠΡΩΤΟΠΡΕΣΒΥΤΕΡΟΥ ΓΕΩΡΓΙΟΥ ΟΙΚΟΝΟΜΟΥ

Αγαπητοί μου αδελφοί εν Χριστώ, ενορίτες και ενορίτισσες του Αγίου Νικολάου!

Ήταν αρχές Δεκέμβρη πάλι, πριν δύο χρόνια, όταν ξεκινούσα τη νέα διακονία μου ως ο ιερέας αυτής της ευλογημένης κοινότητας. Ευχαριστώ και δοξάζω τον Θεό, που με αξιώνει να βρίσκομαι μαζί σας, μέλος της όμορφης αυτής κοινότητας με την σπουδαία ιστορία, αδελφός σας εν Χριστώ, αλλά και πατέρας πνευματικός. Συμπληρώνοντας λοιπόν τα δύο χρόνια θα ήθελα να κάνω έναν μικρό απολογισμό της εμπειρίας και της διακονίας μου στα πρόσωπά σας.

Αυτός ο απολογισμός, ωστόσο, δεν θα αναφέρεται στο δικό μου πρόσωπο. Γιατί στην Ορθόδοξη Εκκλησία και παράδοση το έργο που επιτελούμε δεν είναι δικό μας. Είναι έργο του Χριστού μας. Δεν έχει κανένα νόημα να υπερηφανευόμαστε και να λέμε ότι τάχα έχουμε κάνει σπουδαία πράγματα. Η Εκκλησία είναι ο αμπελώνας του Θεού. Είναι η δική του ποίμνη, Εκείνος είναι ο Ποιμένας ο Καλός και εμείς τα πρόβατα. Είναι το νοερό καράβι, που κυβερνά Εκείνος, και εμείς εμπιστευόμαστε το πνευματικό ταξίδι της ζωής μας στα δικά Του χέρια. Ο Χριστός μας είναι Εκείνος, που ως ο Μέγας Αρχιερέας τελεί τα ιερά μυστήρια και είναι πάντοτε αοράτως παρών, ευλογώντας και αγιάζοντας. Πως θα τολμούσαμε εμείς να πούμε ότι κάνουμε έργα σπουδαία; Αυτό θα ήταν ανόητη αλαζονεία και δίχως νόημα υπερηφάνεια. Ας θυμηθούμε ότι ο Κύριος είπε: «χωρὶς ἐμοῦ οὐ δύνασθε ποιεῖν οὐδέν» (Ιω. 15, 5).

Όλοι εμείς, τα πιστά μέλη της Μίας, Αγίας, Καθολικής και Αποστολικής Εκκλησίας ξαναπροσφέρουμε ταπεινά τα χαρίσματα, που Εκείνος μας χάρισε και γινόμαστε ταπεινοί εργάτες του δικού Του αμπελώνα. Δεν μπορώ λοιπόν να κάνω απολογισμό και να αναφερθώ σε δικό μου έργο, καθώς είμαι ένας ταπεινός και ανάξιος δούλος Του. Μπορώ όμως να μιλήσω για το δικό σας έργο. Και να απαριθμήσω όσα σπουδαία επιτελείτε και είναι προς δόξαν Θεού.

Το σπουδαιότερο από όλα είναι ότι με την αγάπη, τη μέριμνα, τη φροντίδα, την αγωνία, την προσπάθεια, την εθελοντική προσφορά και ακόμα περισσότερο με την πίστη των προγόνων μας και φυλάσσοντας τα ιερά και τα όσια που παραλάβατε η εκκλησία και η κοινότητά μας συνεχίζει την πορεία της δίνοντας μία συγκλονιστική μαρτυρία Ορθοδοξίας και Ελληνισμού στην καρδιά της Αμερικής. Δεν γοητευτήκατε από άλλες θρησκευτικές παραδόσεις, δεν αρνηθήκατε το Άγιο Βάπτισμα και το Άγιο Μύρο που λάβατε, δεν λησμονήσατε την πατρίδα. Αλλά τα έχετε και τα δύο, πρώτα τον Τριαδικό Θεό μας και ύστερα την Ελλάδα μας, σε πρώτη προτεραιότητα.

Αγαπάτε τον εκκλησιασμό. Τελείτε τα πατροπαράδοτα έθιμα και ιερά μυστήρια, τον εκκλησιασμό των νηπίων στις σαράντα μέρες, τις Βαφτίσεις, τους Γάμους, και επίσης τις εξόδιους ακολουθίες και τα ιερά μνημόσυνα. Προσκαλείτε με ευλάβεια στο σπίτι σας τον ιερέα για να τελέσει τον Αγιασμό των Φώτων ή σε άλλη περίοδο του έτους ή το Ιερό Ευχέλαιο. Αγαπάτε την ευπρέπεια του ναού και προσφέρετε ό,τι χρειάζεται η εκκλησία μας στολίζοντας τις εικόνες και δωρίζοντας ιερά άμφια και σκεύη.

Αγαπάτε τους φτωχούς. Και αυτό αποδεικνύεται από το θεάρεστο και ευλογημένο έργο που επιτελεί με διακριτικό τρόπο η Φιλόπτωχος της κοινότητας του Αγίου Νικολάου. Με το σπίτι της Φιλοξενίας, με τρόφιμα σε οικογένειες που τα χρειάζονται, με τη μέριμνα να επικοινωνούν πάντα με όσους ασθενούν ή πενθούν, βοηθώντας για την πληρωμή λογαριασμών αλλά και ενισχύοντας διακονίες των Φιλοπτώχων Αδελφοτήτων της Μητρόπολης και της Αρχιεπισκοπής.

Αγαπάτε την ελληνική γλώσσα. Αυτό φανερώνεται από το Ελληνικό μας Σχολείο, ένα από τα καλύτερα σχολεία της ομογένειας. Το σχολείο αυτό, που διδάσκει την ελληνική γλώσσα, την ελληνική παράδοση, την ελληνική ιστορία. Και τα παιδιά μαθαίνοντας όλα αυτά χτίζουν παράλληλα φιλίες πολύτιμες αλλά και αγαπούν τον χώρο της εκκλησίας θεωρώντας τον σπίτι τους.

Αγαπάτε τα παιδιά. Αγωνιάτε για το μέλλον τους και φροντίζετε να παρέχετε σε αυτά ό,τι σπουδαιότερο και πολυτιμότερο, την αγάπη για την πίστη μας. Ως καρπός αυτής της αγωνίας λειτουργούν υποδειγματικά η GOYA, το Κατηχητικό Σχολείο, Τα «Ελληνικά Χρυσά Φλουριά», η διακονία των παιδιών μέσα στο ιερό. Η προσπάθειά σας αυτή δεν θα πάει χαμένη. Τα παιδιά θα αγαπήσουν την εκκλησία και όταν έρθει η ώρα θα αναλάβουν τα ηνία. Προσευχόμαστε και ελπίζουμε κάποια από αυτά τα παιδιά μεγαλώνοντας να σπουδάσουν στη Θεολογική Σχολή του Τιμίου Σταυρού στη Βοστώνη, να γίνουν ιερείς ή πρεσβυτέρες, ψάλτες, αγιογράφοι, μέλη του Ενοριακού Συμβουλίου και να βοηθήσουν στη συνέχιση αυτού του ευλογημένου έργου οδηγώντας την κοινότητα όλο και ψηλότερα. Για να είναι πάντα μία ζωντανή μαρτυρία Ορθοδοξίας και Ελλάδας αγκαλιάζοντας ανεξαίρετα κάθε άνθρωπο καλής προαίρεσης, που αναζητά την Αλήθεια.

Με αυτές τις σκέψεις, που μοιράστηκα, ως απολογισμό όσων έζησα αυτά τα δύο χρόνια μαζί σας προσπάθησα να δω, όπως λένε ειδικοί επιστήμονες «το ποτήρι μισογεμάτο και όχι μισοάδειο». Ασφαλώς υπάρχουν παραλείψεις, γίνονται λάθη και υπάρχει περιθώριο μεγάλης βελτίωσης σε όλους τους τομείς της διακονίας μας. Αυτό μας υπενθυμίζει την ανθρώπινη φύση και αδυναμία μας και τα λόγια του Χριστού, που αναφέραμε στην αρχή του άρθρου μας, ότι χωρίς Εκείνον δεν μπορούμε να κάνουμε τίποτα.

Βαδίζοντας στον τελευταίο μήνα του 2024 και οραματιζόμενοι το νέο έτος 2025 και τα επόμενα χρόνια ας προσευχηθούμε από τα βάθη της καρδιάς μας ζητώντας από τον Θεό διά πρεσβειών του Αγίου μας Νικολάου, του οποίου θα εορτάσουμε σε λίγες μέρες την ιερά πανήγυρη, να ευλογεί την κοινότητά μας, να προστατεύει όλο τον κόσμο και να φέρει την ειρήνη.

The Nativity of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Flesh

Introduction

The Feast of the Nativity of Jesus is one of the most joyful days of the Orthodox Church. It ranks next to the greatest holiday, the Resurrection of Jesus. The Feast of the Birth of Jesus is also known as the "Incarnation of Christ." This means that Jesus became a man and came into the world to save us. We also refer to this joyous feast as Christmas.

Biblical Story

The story of the Nativity of Christ is beautifully told in the Holy Scriptures. The story is found in Matthew 1:18-25 and in Luke 2:1-20. No matter how often the Birth of Jesus is told, we realize that it is an important event.

As the story is told by the Apostles, the Roman Empire was powerful. The Romans had conquered much of the then known Judea Samaria, what we know today as Israel, were included in their conquests. **Emperor** Augustus ordered that a census be taken in all his lands. He needed to know how many people lived in the empire so he could tax them. Everyone had to go to the town of their family's origin to register for the census. This meant that Mary and Joseph had to go to Bethlehem. They were descendants of King David and Bethlehem was the City of David.

Mary and Joseph lived in Nazareth and it was a great distance from Bethlehem. It was about 100 miles over very rugged roads. Moreover, Mary was expecting the baby

and it was almost time for her to give birth. Bethlehem was a small town and there were many descendants of David who had come to register for the census. By the time Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem there was no place for them to stay. Joseph tried very hard to find a place to sleep that evening. There was no room at the inn. Finally, Joseph found a cave-like place where they could rest. This place was used by shepherds to protect their sheep in stormy weather. It was here that Mary gave birth to Jesus. The baby was wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in the straw in the manger.

Now, that night the shepherds were out in the fields guarding their sheep. Suddenly, there was a bright light which startled the shepherds. The light was so bright that it turned the night into daylight. Of course, the shepherds were frightened. Nothing such as this had ever happened. Soon an angel appeared and calmed them. The angel said:

"Fear not for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior; which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you: You shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger" (Luke 2:11-12).

Then a larger group of angels appeared. They praised and glorified God and sang, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, and good will toward men" (Luke 2:14). When the angels finished singing, they disappeared and the light began to fade. It became dimmer and dimmer until it was dark again. The shepherds were awed. They didn't know what to do. Finally, they decided to leave their flocks of sheep and go to Bethlehem. They decided that they wanted to see for themselves what the angels had told them. When they got to Bethlehem, they found Mary, Joseph, and the infant Jesus. They fell to their knees and adored Jesus.

Some Wise Men came from the East for they knew of the coming of Jesus. They had seen a star that told them that a new king had been born to the Jews. They followed the star and were looking for the child. At this time the governor of Judea was King Herod. He was a wicked man and was feared and hated by the people. When Herod heard about the Wise Men looking for the child, he invited them to his palace. Herod asked the Wise Men to find the child so that he, too, could worship Him. But Herod was lying. He did not want anyone to take his place. The Wise Men went on to look for Jesus. The Star led them to Jesus and Mary. When the

Men found Jesus, they fell to their knees and worshipped Him. They gave Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The Wise Men left but did not return to Herod. They had a dream that warned them that Herod wanted to harm Jesus. Instead, they returned to their native country by a different route.

Icon of the Feast

The icon of the Nativity tells the story of Christ's birth from the Scriptures. It also shows that all creation is taking part in Christ's birth. The angels give thanks with their song; the heavens give the star; the Wise Men give their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The poor, humble shepherds give their praise and amazement; the earth gives the cave, and humanity gives the Virgin.

This Holy Icon is an icon with many scenes. First, it stresses the importance of the Theotokos, the Mother of Jesus. She is placed in the center and is the largest figure in the icon. In this icon, she is kneeling with crossed arms, looking at the Christ child. The three stars, denoting her virginity before, during, and after the Nativity, are on her garments. The Christ Child, in the center of the icon, is in swaddling clothes and is lying in the manger. In the background is the dark cave where He was born. In the cave are an ox and a donkey guarding the newborn Babe. Even though the Gospels say nothing of the cave, this information is from Holy Tradition. Neither do the Gospels speak of the ox and the donkey, but all icons of the Nativity include these animals. Including the animals in the icon fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah 1:3, "The ox knows his master, and the donkey his master's crib; but Israel does not know me, and the people have not regarded me." The long ray of light from the star points directly to the cave. This ray comes from the star and travels to all parts of the world. It teaches that this bright star is an astronomical happening, and is a messenger from heaven announcing the birth of Jesus.

On the left hand side of the icon is another scene. The Wise Men, who were led by the star, are riding horses to bring their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to Jesus. The Wise Men are of various ages. One is without a beard. In those days, young

men did not wear beards. The other Wise Man has long hair and a long beard, which indicates that he is much older. These details teach that regardless of age and appearance, the Good News was given to each and everyone.

Opposite the Wise Men is the scene with the humble shepherds. An angel proclaims the glad tidings. A young shepherd plays a reed instrument. This scene reveals that the music of the humans was added to the hymn of the angels. Across from the shepherd's scene is the heavenly choir of angels. They are giving glory to God. The angels serve two purposes in the Nativity of Christ. They give glory to God and announce the good news to all mankind.

The background shows a very rugged terrain. This is not a true representation of the land in this area. Joseph could not find room in Bethlehem, so they went outside of Bethlehem to a cave. This rocky mountain formation only serves as a background for the event.

In the lower part of the icon are two more scenes. In the right hand corner are the two women Joseph brought to take care of the Christ child. They are bathing Him just as any baby is bathed. The humanity of Jesus is clearly shown in this setting.

Opposite the bathing of Jesus scene sits a sad and worried Joseph. He is not part of the central group the Christ Child and the Theotokos. Joseph is not the natural father. Joseph is troubled and despondent. There is an old man talking to Joseph. The old man is Satan. Satan can appear in many forms. Here he is as an old man who is tempting Joseph and disturbing him. Satan is telling Joseph that virgin birth is impossible. He's telling Joseph that he's a fool if he believes this. This story comes to us from Holy Tradition. The sad Joseph shows us not only his personal predicament but the dilemma of all mankind the difficulty of accepting that which is "beyond words or reason."

The tree, which is in the middle of the lower part of the icon, is a symbol of the Tree of Jesse. This tree refers to Isaiah 11:1-2, "But a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom. The spirit of the Lord shall

rest upon Him." King David was often mentioned as the son of Jesse and Jesus was from the House of David.

The Holy Icon of the Nativity reminds one to praise and glorify the Birth of Christ. The celebration of Christmas each year serves to remind each and everyone of us that Christ came for you and me.

The Orthodox Celebration of the Feast of the Nativity

As with Pascha, or Easter, the Feast of the Nativity begins with a period of preparation. It is proceeded by a fast corresponding to Lent and lasting for forty days. The fast begins on November 15.

On the Sundays immediately before December 25, special commemorations emphasize the link between the Old Covenant and the New. On December 20 the Forefeast of the Nativity is commemorated, and the daily liturgical texts are directed toward the Feast itself. On Christmas Eve, services include the Great or Royal Hours, the Great Vespers, and the Liturgy of Saint Basil.

On Christmas Day the service commemorates the birth of Christ in Bethlehem, the adoration of the Shepherds, and the arrival of the Wise Men with their gifts. The service held on this day is the Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom.

The days following Christmas are associated with the Theotokos and Joseph. December 26 is the Synaxis of the Mother of God, and the first Sunday after the Feast commemorates "Joseph the Betrothed." December 29 commemorates the Massacre of the Innocents, and January 1 the Circumcision of our Lord. The Nativity season concludes on December 31, but the spirit of the festival extends to the celebration of Theophany (Epiphany), the feast commemorating the Baptism of our Lord in the Jordan River.

And there was no one who stood with me against them, except Michael, your prince. (*Daniel 10:21*)

Beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

In the visions of the Prophet Daniel, Archangel Michael is revealed as a powerful force for good and protection against every possible evil. If you look through the Holy Scriptures, you will read of Angels appearing in all manner of places — sometimes in numbers that even defy the imagination. But we should always bear in mind that "Angel" means "messenger," someone who is delivering to us an important communication from the Heavenly Realm.

Every year, on November 8, we celebrate the Synaxis of the Holy Angels — all Nine Ranks of them, who are led by their Chief Commanders, Michael and Gabriel. At the same time, we take time to remember Saint Michael's Home, our Archdiocesan Institution that cares for the elderly. Archangel Michael is considered the residents' special protector and guardian, who stands with them in this life and the next.

This year, let us all consider a donation — of any size — to Saint Michael's Home in order to support the generation that came before us. Holy Scripture speaks of a moment when Archangel Michael was the only one to take a stand and make a defense. But the message is clear, all of us can take our place with the Holy Archangel to become an impenetrable wall of support and prayer for our aged. And in doing so, we will contribute to the construction of the new walls that will house and protect our elderly at the new Saint Michael's Home.

Οἱ ἄρχοντες προστατεύουν τὰ συμφέροντα τῆς Μητρὸς Ἐκκλησίας καὶ τῆς Ἱερᾶς Ἁρχιεπισκοπῆς μας, μὲ κάθε τρόπο, σὲ ὅλους τοὺς δημοσίους ἢ ἰδιωτικοὺς ὀργανισμούς. Πολλὲς κοινότητές μας ἔχουν μέλη ποὺ εἶναι ἄρχοντες. «ἄρχων» εἶναι ἕνα ὀφφίκιο ἢ ἀξίωμα, τὸ ὁποῖο ἐγκρίνεται προσωπικὰ ἀπὸ τὸν ἴδιον τὸν Παναγιώτατο Οἰκουμενικὸ Πατριάρχη.
